Peggy has always been fascinated by bugs, rocks, porcupines, arrowheads, and history plaques at the side of the road.


Curiosity fuels her writing, and has taken her deep into dusty archives, and down the Peruvian Amazon; anything to find the primary sources that bring her subjects to life.
